growing number of Nepalis leave the country A for higher education, Health Management International (HCMI) - a Singapore-based global healthcare recruitment and educational network - has ventured into Nepal to lure and counsel students aspiring to be doctors to the leading Philippines universities.

It introduced a veritable set of medical curriculum at the eleven Philippines universities for MBBS degree in Nepal last week. "For this year's session starting in September, we target to take in 500 students," said Baljit Singh, managing director of HCMI.

Talking to the Post, he elaborated that the cost of pursing MBBS in the Philippines was affordable compared to India, Bangladesh and even private medical colleges of Nepal. It stands in a range of 24,000 to 30,000 US dollar for five and a half years, and the cost of living is 120 dollar per month including the cost of lodging.

The names of the universities HCMI has included into its service list are University of Nothern Philippines, Davao Medical School Foundation, Cagaian State University, Our Lady of Fatima University, Emilio Anguinaldo College, University of the East Ramon Magasasay and Tarlac State Iniversy.

All lese universities are

sponsored through the Commission for Higher Education (CHED), which is the Education Ministry of the Philippines. The curriculum is recognized by the World Health Organization and also the US Department of Education.

Singh further said that Nepal came into focus of HCMI after it received several enquiries for the MBBS program. "We received a number of enquiries from Nepal through our offices located in India and Dhaka. It encouraged us to come to Nepal," said he.

Referring that Nepal has MBBS program seats of just cialized about 1,000, Singh said that the number if very low compared to the number of doctors the country required to serve the people. "A lot of students aspire to be doctors, but they do not get chance to pursue MBBS due to limited seats quota in Nepal. Those who can afford ultimately go abroad for the study. We want to tap that prospect," said Singh.

However, HCMI has not just the enrollment interest in Nepal. Singh said the company wishes to have longer-term business partnership in Nepal on the health sector. The company has opened HCMI Education in order to extend its services and establish broader alliance with the healthcare

"We expect the government to assess the country's healthcare requirements and facilitate the alliance building process," said Singh, adding that the Philippines can provide training facilities and launch special training courses at its training hospitals or in Nepal, exchange faculties and support Nepal in dealing with present shortage of medical professionals and other specialized healthcare manpower.

Moreover, he stated the HCMI was also considering to provide scholarships to the deserving students pursuing MBBS in the Philippines. "We will have that in the future," said he, adding that the Philippines has students from Bangladesh, India, the US, Korea and Hong Kong, among others.

Philippines education is founded on the US system and there are various advantages of studying in the Philippines, according to Singh. "It is an English speaking country. The cost of education is lower. Quality of education is much high, well supported by a good infrastructure and excellent education system," said he. (PR)
